Overview

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

To increase the value of your investment in excess of 7% a year, net of fees, over any 5 year period. There is no certainty the investment objective will be achieved. This is through a combination of capital growth (which is profit on investments held) and income (which is money paid out of investments such as dividends from shares and interest from bonds).

SUITABILITY

Investments are suitable for retail investors whose investment requirements are aligned with the objectives, policies and risk profile of the Fund.

ASSET ALLOCATION PROFILE

The Fund is actively managed, meaning Arbion Itd (the "Investment Manager") decides which investments to buy and sell, and when. The Fund will have exposure to a broad range of asset classes and investments across different industries and geographical regions, however not all asset classes may be held at all times. This will include:

- Between 70% and 100% in shares of companies
- Up to 30% in bonds and cash
- Up to 20% in alternative assets in total; of which the Fund will have:
 - Up to 10% in regulated funds employing a hedge fund type strategy and
 - Up to 20% in structured products, which are investments whose returns are linked to underlying assets or markets (such as shares, bonds, currencies, commodities or interest rates), including actively managed certificates, a type of structured product that combines elements of traditional certificates with active management strategies.




